

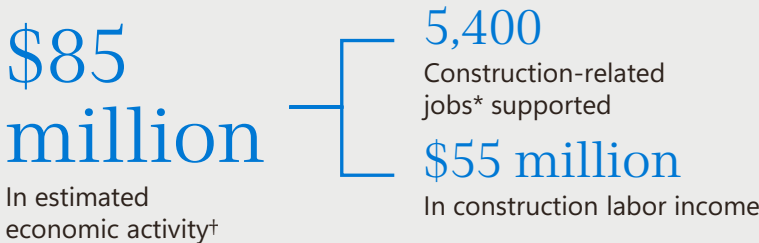
Microsoft's datacenter economic impact in Johor Bahru



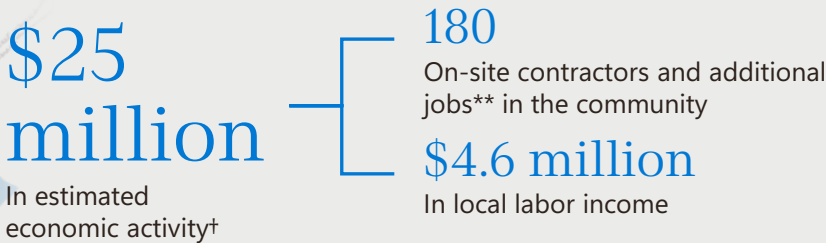
Microsoft is making significant long-term investments in datacenters in Johor Bahru. This overview summarizes the estimated economic impact of those investments, including job creation, labor income, community investments, and broader economic activity.

†Economic activity is how people earn and spend money, enabling communities to grow through jobs, shopping, and local services.

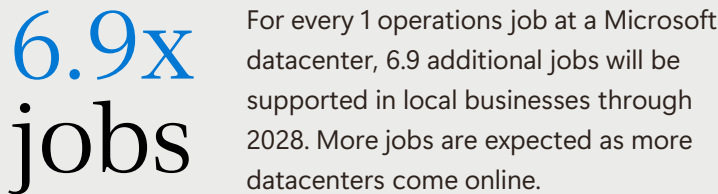
*Construction-related jobs include direct on-site construction labor, indirect jobs within regional supply chains, and induced jobs supported by household spending.

**Local jobs include direct Microsoft datacenter employees, indirect supplier and service-provider jobs, and induced jobs supported when workers spend earnings locally.

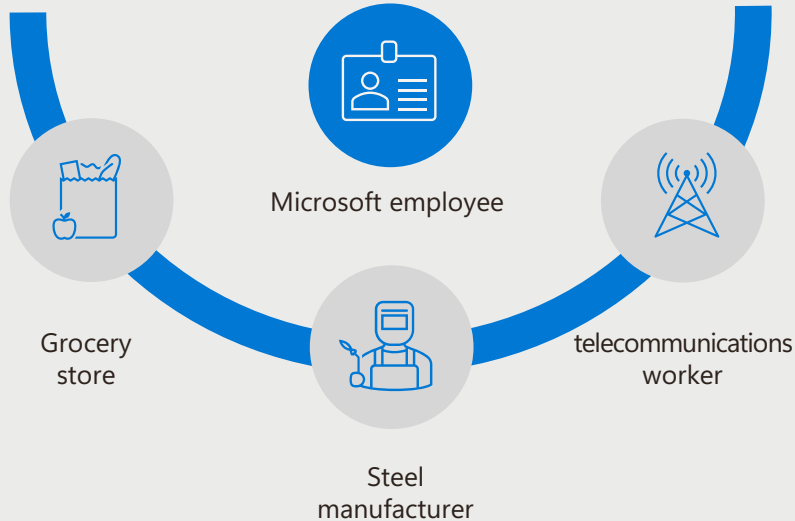

Community investments

We invest hyper-locally where we build datacenters. In Johor Bahru, we have supported STEM education opportunities, skilling and technology development, and the local environment through community investments.

One example is the Datacenter Skills2Work program, delivered in collaboration with Universiti Teknologi Malaysia (UTM). The program incorporates elements of Microsoft's Introduction to Datacenters curriculum and has provided industry-relevant training to more than 1,000 young people aged 18-35, seeking to prepare them for careers in the digital economy.
